We entered a journey of transforming a former church into a functional and welcoming office and tutoring center. By November 2022, we were hosting after-school tutoring at our new building. In April, we moved in fully, and in September, we hosted our ribbon cutting. We've settled into our new space and it is suiting us very well.


In 2022, our literacy programs reached nearly 200 learners in our traditional one-onone tutoring, and another 100 students through our partnership with SPARKS at Meridian and Coleman Elementary Schools. Our prevention team launched our first ever youth development conference for professionals working with youth and collaborated to create our community's overdose fatality review team.

Changing lives through education

The Legacy Center continues to see growth in all of our tutoring programs. In 2022-23, we offered the Barton reading program, JUMP Math, Adult Basic Education, English as a Second Language, and a new summer program partnership with community centers and a county school called the Read2Lead Summer program.

After tutoring for three years, almost all of it online, Jaylin is reading at grade level. Her mom called the summer before high school, "the summer of books." She read at least fifteen!

The Gus Macker returned for its 9th year in Midland and its 3rd year as a fundraiser for The Legacy Center. A boost to the local economy, the tournament drew more than 1,300 players to downtown Midland
